Key elements of Transition pathway co-implementation

- Commitments by stakeholders:
 - ✓ Collection and publication of concrete pledges continuous
- Engagement of all EU institutions and services, Member States
 - ✓ EU Agenda for Tourism
- Informal Commission expert group (stakeholder working groups) coordinated by DG GROW (call launched @ <u>Register of Commission expert groups and other</u> <u>similar entities (europa.eu)</u>, open until end February)
- **Collaboration platform for stakeholders** (proposals under evaluation, pilot implementation autumn 2023)
- Continuous communication and outreach
- Yearly assessment or progress

Continuing pledge collection

- **260 published pledges** on 25 topic areas, 142 committed organisations from 30 countries

- Continuous follow-up and feedback on pledge proposals with 2-3 yearly cut-off dates for publication: next pledge publication –March 2023

Green transition actions:

Sustainable mobility – transport companies reduce GHG, sustainable mobility plans, increasing use of sustainable modalities

Circularity of tourism services – reducing environmental footprint of food services, reducing waste, increasing water efficiency, energy efficiency, use of renewable energy

Supporting SMEs towards green practices – EMAS, EU ecolabel and other EN ISO 14024 type ecolabels, using EU Green public procurement criteria

Including key sustainability indicators on destination level to a harmonised tourism data collection framework – linked to revising European tourism statistics

R&I support for models and transferable practices for sustainable tourism

Establishing **large-scale pilots on sustainable tourism**, e.g. on islands and remote regions, including outermost regions

Promoting the use of **Product and Organisation Environmental Footprint (PEF and OEF) methodology** and development of sectorial category rules for tourism ecosystem





Circular economy actions for tourism: What else Commission is doing?

- Separating bio waste. According to the EU waste framework directive, by 31 December 2023, all member states, citizens and businesses, including large and small HORECA establishments, will have to separate their biowaste for collection.
- Reduce packaging waste, reuse and recycle. Proposal for a revision of EU legislation on Packaging and Packaging Waste: reduce the generation of packaging waste, boost the use of reusable packaging (reuse and refill), make packaging fully recyclable by 2030.
- Developing Product Environmental Footprint Category rules for hotel accommodations. Upcoming a call for tenders on a new project by DG GROW: "Development of Product Environmental Footprint Category Rules (PEFCRs) and acquisition of relevant EF compliant datasets for hotel accommodation sector".
- New landing page for the tourism sector will be published soon on the EMAS website (www.emas.eu)
